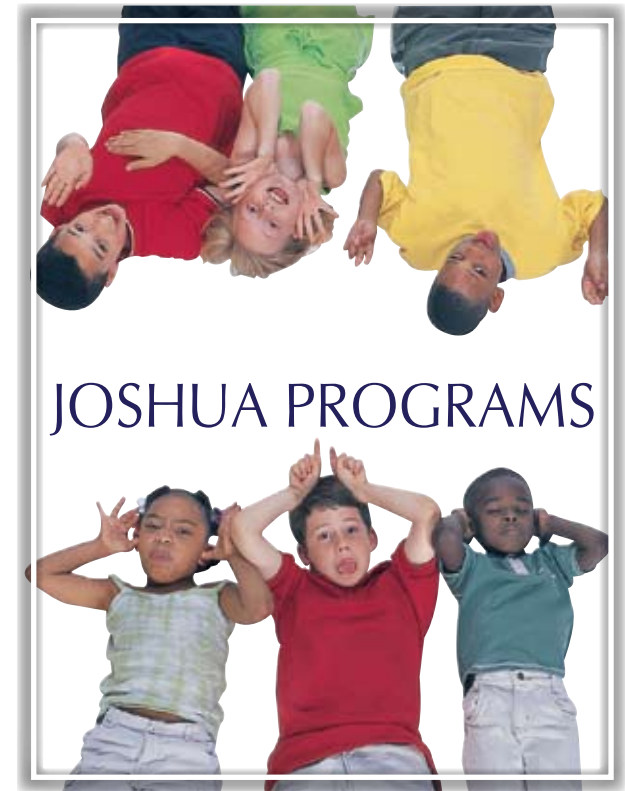

JOSHUA PROGRAMS

Natchaug Hospital's **JOSHUA PROGRAMS** provide at-risk children and adolescents ages 5-18 with treatment for social and emotional difficulties including mental illness, substance abuse and emotional trauma. Founded in 1989, Joshua Programs help more than 900 children and adolescents each year from over 60 Connecticut towns.

Transportation is provided from school to the Joshua Program and then to the student's home.

Joshua Programs, one component of Natchaug Hospital's continuum of care, help children who need more intensive treatment than traditional outpatient care. Joshua Program treatment combines group therapy, psycho-education, individual and family treatment, and medication management.

Partial Hospital Program (PHP) provides four hours of intensive psychiatric support daily for up to five days per week. The program can eliminate the need for a hospital stay, and/or help with the transition back to home and regular school after a period of inpatient care.

Intensive Outpatient program (IOP) is somewhat less intense than the PHP, providing three hours of intensive treatment each day for up to five days each week. The IOP program is designed to help continue progress with behavioral health stabilization and recovery.

Extended Day Treatment is a specialized therapeutic support program for at-risk children and adolescents (8-18 years old), providing structured therapeutic groups for three hours each day for an average of six months.



Services include:

- ◆ Comprehensive assessment, which may include psychiatric evaluation and psychological testing.
- ◆ Comprehensive aftercare planning.
- ◆ Family, group, and individual therapy.
- ◆ Occupational and creative rehabilitation therapy.

Juvenile Justice: Natchaug conducts comprehensive outpatient psychological, psychiatric and chemical dependency evaluations for Connecticut's juvenile justice system.

IICAPS (Intensive In-home Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Services) is a community based program working with families of children with emotional and behavioral difficulties. A team of a Master's level Clinician and Bachelor's level Counselor meet with the child and family, and also coordinate with collaterals. The service is provided 5-7 hours per week for approximately 6-9 months. It is a family focused, strengths-based model, designed and monitored by Yale.
